

PAIN OUT is a multi-national research project that combines a quality improvement approach as well as a large prospective research project: PAIN OUT provides a unique and user-friendly web-based information system to improve treatment of patients with post-operative pain. The project offers a system for measurement and feedback of outcome quality and supports the process of decision making in order to achieve an optimized treatment of patients. Furthermore, the large registry allows comparison of quality indicators related to postoperative care between different countries and healthcare settings and provides clinicians, hospitals and other stakeholders with treatment recommendations based on “real-life” data on patients' outcome. From 2009-2012, PAIN OUT was funded by the European Commission's 7th Framework Programme. Since 2013, PAIN OUT is being continued in cooperation with scientific pain societies, e.g. IASP and EFIC.
